map of viana do castelo























(dock on the right margin of the Lima river). Heading towards the centre of "Lanheses", part of this trail is

also part of the famous St. James's Pathway. Thousands of pilgrims have travelled on this path through the centuries, as well as ox

carts filled with ceramic roof tiles, bricks and dishware which were delivered to various parts of the region by way of the legendary river. Amidst the vegetation, Hikers will be able to find the "Linhares" bridge which runs over the 'olho' creek and a bit further ahead you will reach "Largo da Seara". There is an open air museum with several objects from the era when thriving trade flowed through the area. As you travel up the incline, you will walk past the "Lanheses" Parish Church, also known as "Santa Eulália" church, and "Senhora do Cruzeiro" chapel. Head towards the industrial park. You will come to "Santo Antão" chapel and right after, amongst the pine trees, vineyards and farming fields are the villages of "Meixedo" and "Vilar de Murteda". Here, next to the Parish Church, there is a Calvary with seven stone crosses located next to the Parish Church. There is also a hostel. Continue through a tree covered area and you will arrive at one of the most typical and picturesque mountain villages in the region – "São Lourenço da Montaria", known for its traditional mills, which are still operational; the characteristic landscape of "Serra d'Arga";

and the typical regional delicacies. As you head toward "S. João d'Arga", admire the landscape the areas of "Espantar", "Trás-Âncora" and "Pedrulhos" have to offer,

enjoy the views of the mountainous areas of "Perre" and "Santa Luzia" with the Atlantic Ocean in the background.
